however she did offer the work of drafting and mechanical engineering as a field in which there is quite a bit of opportunity for women and of course the ever glamorous and at present expanding field of hostessing on an airliner is open to a limited group of young women so if you have two foreign languages at least a year of experience in the states a charming disposition and a perfectly healthy constitution you that all you need to become a transoceanic air line hostess of course if youre a homebody airline lines in the states are taking girls at present who have one or more years of college however if you had hoped to be a pilot you had better put the dream in moth balls for the time being as women pilots on commercial airlines are a "species non-existentia"
