






































Year In Review

a debate about male and female relationships.



Overall, Looney Tunes Weekend was a huge success. Congratulations to CCB and all those that contributed to Spring Fever '89.





Through Their Years

The end of the 1989 academic school year also marks the end of the careers of four Albright faculty members. Dr. James D. Reppert, Dr. Ronald E. Cocroft, Dr. Annadora V. Shirk, and Benjamin E. Brown are leaving the Albright family.

Dr. Shirk holds the M.A. from the University of Pittsburgh and the Ph.D. in rhetoric and communication from Temple University. Since Dr. Shirk joined the Albright faculty in 1946, she has been a professor of English and speech communication, a past chairperson of her department and cited for "excellence in teaching" with the college's Christian R. and Mary F. Lindback Award.

An honors graduate of Muhlenberg, Dr. Reppert received the M.A. and Ph.D. in English from Harvard University, where he was a graduate assistant before joining the Albright faculty in 1953. Dr. Reppert received a Lindback Award for "excellence in teaching" and was founder of Albright's literary magazine, *The Agon*. He was also founder of the Film Society and the recipient of two National Humanities' grants on Black Studies.

Professor Brown has taught the classics in English since joining the Albright staff in 1952. He earned the A.B. and M.A. in literature from the University of Pittsburgh, and has completed graduate work at Duquesne University and at the Universities of London and Toronto.

Professor Brown was a recipient of the Lindback Award for "excellence in teaching" and maintains affiliations in the Modern Language Association, College English Association, and Milton, Renaissance and Medieval Societies.

The most recent chairperson of the classical languages has been Reverend Or. Cocroft who joined the Albright staff in 1956.

A graduate of the Evangelical School of Theology, then at Albright, he holds the doctor of theology from Princeton Theological. He has been an ordained minister in the United Methodist Church since 1953, and has served as pastor at the Independent Lutheran Church of Reading since 1959.

Everyone at Albright will miss these fine professors and wishes them the best of luck in the future.




In 1932, President W.F. Teel died and the burden of securing Albright was left to Dr. J. Warren Klein. At one time the college was in \$500,000 debt and the possibility of foreclosing the mortgages on the science hall and the School of Theology (now Teel Hall) existed. Fortunately, Mrs. Annie Merner Pfeiffer lended her hand and by 1938 the liquidation of this debt was in sight.



On February 2, 1938, the trustees of Albright College announced that Dr. Harry V. Masters had been elected as president. His contributions are forever remembered through Masters Hall.




Krause Hall was erected in 1948 as a gift from the federal government and dedicated, in 1952, to the memory of Sarah E. Krause, wife of Lewis D. Krause, a benefactor of the college.



The Merner-Pfeiffer-Klein Memorial Chapel-Auditorium was dedicated in 1960. Meanwhile, an addition to the Alumni Memorial Library had been completed in 1956.



Two new dormitories, North Hall and West Hall, were completed in 1962. This need for dorm space caused the college to purchase four large residences to use as fraternity houses.




In 1988 construction began for the Center for Computing and Mathematics. The end of the academic year 1989 marked its completion.


Another Tough Year


Baseball Has Bright Future


Another Strong Season

Congratulations and Best of Luck to the Class of 1989.




the classroom. I would especially like to thank the people that I have had the privilege of working with in these four years, it is you that makes Albright the special place that it is.
