




## "A CAMPUS THOUGHT"






During halftime, the Albright band performed and the Senior parents were introduced. First prize for the float competition went to Crowell Dorm.



According to Linda Brown, Director of Alumni Relations, Homecoming 1984 was a huge success due to the outstanding student participation and the attendance of many friends and alumni.



#### FEMALE TRANSPORT



An early 19th-century convict ship amid storm-tossed seas was the setting for the first Domino Players' production of the '84-'85 season. But the tempestuous journey is mild in comparison to the churning emotions that surface within the ship. Stephen Goochs' Female Transport captures with graphic detail the intensity, frustration and fury of six female convicts trapped and apparently at the mercy of the ship's male crew.


The intensely feministic piece traces the 152-day journey from England to Australia. The six prisoners convicted of crimes ranging from prostitution to pick-pocketing are thrown together and find themselves immediately at odds. As the journey passes, however, the women unite to overcome their mutual enemies: boredom, sickness, and their sadistic male oppressors. Although one is driven to suicide, the remaining five bond together to survive and leave the ship in joyous triumph.

The cast of **Female Transport** were Lori Burcosky, Kathy Cleary, June Debus, Elizabeth Kress, Connie Kurtz, Sue Tennis, Mike Mietz, Joe Mallon, Todd Kelly, and Richard Mell.

The Domino production under the direction of Dr. Lynn Morrow was entered in the American College Theatre Festival along with over 50 productions from other colleges located in Delaware, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Washington D.C. Although **Female Transport** was not one of the three non-student written plays selected, it was chosen as the first alternate to the festival — a tribute to the dedication and excellence of the actors, crews, designers and directors.

Commencing with a subdued graduation ceremony, Merrily We Roll Along spirals outward with color and sound that fill the theater and propel the cast and audience into the story. The Stephen Sondheim musical marked the third and final Domino Players Co. production of the year and was the united effort of more than 50 Albright students, the music department, and community members.

Merrily traces 25 years in the wes of three friends: Frank, a composer (Jeff Lentz); Charley, a lyricist (Todd Kelly); and Mary, a writer (Anna Mae Weikel). The show centers around the trials and triumphs their friendship; must endure through their struggle to produce a show, their climb to the top of the industry, and their attempts to stay there. Gradually, Frank becomes swept up in the money and glamour and becays and sunders the friendship.

The twist to the show is that the entire plot is performed backwards as a series of flashbacks. Frank, having lost his dreams, returns to his high school to speak at graduation about the "realities" of life. The graduates, unwilling to accept such bleak futures, ask Frank how he got this way, and they "roll merrily along" back through time to discover where he went wrong.

Creating the other roles in the production were Lauren Burnbauer, Daryl McCullough, Karen Luckenbach, Nancy Clark, June Debus, Andy DePrisco, Denise Hann, Stacey Henninger, Luke Huggins, Christopher Hughes, Kent Jackson, Valerie Keller, Laurie Nelson, Richard Sabine, Beth Schroeder, Ralia Vardaxis, and Jay Yasenchak.







# MDA Dance Marathon— "MDA ROCKS"






The 1985 Muscular Dystrophy Dance Marathon . . . special feelings evolve from the hearts of many when that event is brought to mind. The caring and dedication of a number of students and organizations made this year's marathon the most successful in its six-year history at Albright. Well over twelve thousand dollars were raised for MDA — this is by far the largest single contribution in Berks County.

The extensive planning and preparations done by the marathon committees culminated in the official ''Albright College Dance Marathon Weekend'' as designated by Mayor Karen Miller. This year, fifty-five energetic couples put the woes of studying behind them and dedicated themselves to dancing in the 50-hour event.

All were psyched and ready to go as the opening ceremonies began at 7:00 on February 22. A feeling of caring and purpose could be sensed through the opening speeches. Deb Gober, MDA district representative, expressed the hope that someday a cure would be found for muscular dystrophy and that fund raisers such as this one would be unnecessary.

After the introduction of the dancers and the lighting of the fifty hour candle, the marathon was underway. As the evening progressed, the dancers and the student body were entertained by WRFY D.J. John Ryan. Many food and game booths provided spectators with quite a variety. From Hillel's Ice Cream to Psych Society's Funnel Cakes and from APO's roulette wheel to A-Phi-O's "Scream Machine", there was something for everyone; all were encouraged

to enjoy themselves and donate all they could to MDA intertainment in the latter part of the evening was provided through the "talent" show. For the Jancers, the 3am bedtime call was gratefully received. Sleeping in the theater was a new experience to most, as was getting only three hours of rest.

The dancers were forced up at 6:30 am to enjoy a quick shower, a quick breakfast, a short aerobics session and a Beach Party. Saturday's events inluded a pop band, a breakdancing exhibition, and Delta Chi's popular Pie Throw Booth. Running totals were placed on the board at various intervals. The dancers competed for fun in a Sponsor T-shirt contest, Line Dance contest, Battle of the Airbands, and Talent show. Saturday night the Campus Center rocked to the sound of **Trigger**. Later on, the dancers enjoyed an entertaining slide show and continued bopping again until 3 am.

Sunday morning found the dancers in exhausted but positive spirits. They were treated to their second, more extensive aerobics session and engaged themselves in reading the Sunday paper and





watching rock videos. The dancers often let themselves loose and formed a train which circled the Campus Center and traveled out into the warm Reading sunshine. Sunday afternoon brought the great band **Side Effects**, along with the auction and Dr. Ruffer's homemade beef noodle soup. After a Domino's dinner break, the dancers returned, rejuvinated with an energy that carried them through till the end. As Billy Joel's "Piano Man" blared out, the dancers joined together while spectators and supporters closed in on the circle. Such an internal sense of accomplishment could be felt by the family of dancers when they realized they had indeed made it.

Emotions boiled over during the closing ceremonies. The marathon candle was extinguished; carnations were given out to all the dancers; recognition, praise and gratitude were given to all those who made the marathon such a success; and the final total was placed on the board.





### DORMS COMPETE — SPIRIT SEMESTER

One of the most exciting experiences to hit Albright's campus in 1984-1985 was the initiation of "Spirit Semester". Jane Schawm, this year's Resident Students Association President, had seen a similar program at another school, and with the advice of Charlotte March, single-handedly promoted and pushed for its eventual success.

The basic idea was to try to generate enthusiasm and school spirit through campus and dorm-wide events. The RA's and the Dorm Council were to plan, organize and carry out a variety of programs with different point values and at the end of the semester, the dorms with the highest totals would receive a large cash prize. This year, the prizes were \$600, \$300, and \$100, respectively.

Although it began quietly with a few R.S.A. functions to attract attention, the idea soon caught on and the dorms began in earnest to rally for points. Some of the ideas that imaginative residents came up with included raffles, Breakfast-In-Bed, a Pizza Eating Contest, Blood Drives, guest speakers, 60's Beach Party Dance, ice cream socials, a golf tournament, ice skating party, Progressive Dinner, and in-dorm movies. The R.S.A. officers and dorm-liasons monitored attendace at athletic events, sponsored a band in the bay, and posted Trivia Questions in the Albrightian.

Despite warnings that students might need a few years to warm up to an idea as unique as this, Spirit Semester caught on tremendously and established a firm hold in Albright's residential traditions. Pam Brewer, Director of Housing, was very impressed with Jane's devotion and hard work, and also with the incredible increase in residence programming. In fact, since 1982 there has been an estimated 450% increase in the number of monthly dorm activities. Brewer also noted how Spirit Semester helped to spur involvement and create unity and excitement within the dorms.

Spirit Semester will definitely be back next year with a few improvements; many of those persons closely involved with the programming itself felt that it ran for too long. Schawm said that next year Spirit Semester will end in December instead of continuing through January as it did this year.


The final standings announced during a comedy act at the end of interim, were memorable. Court, the biggest dorm on campus, closed with 2954 points and received the grand prize of six hundred dollars. The smallest dorm, Selwyn, interestingly came in second for three hundred dollars with a point total of 2317. Crowell and Mohn Hall tied for third place with point totals of 1758 and each received a check for seventy five dollars. Following in fourth through eighth place were Krause, Walton, Smith and Woods, respectively.

All in all, it can be consided that the initiation of Spirit Semester was a great success that will be continued in future years.

# Cabaret Night





On March 7, 1985, BAR presented its third annual Cabaret Night. The theme for the evening was "New Wave Cabaret," and the Campus Center was decorated accordingly—as were the waitresses—in bright colors and non-traditional fashions.

The purpose of the annual event is to remind students that it is possible to have fun without consuming alcohol. This is achieved through the creation of a nightclub atmosphere, complete with dancing and drinks (of course, non-alcoholic). Entertainment is provided — with an educational theme running throughout the evening.

All campus organizations are invited to participate in the annual skit competition, which provides the bulk of the entertainment. The skits are judged by a panel of Albright staff along with Reading community members who are known for their involvement in alcohol/drug awareness groups.

In addition to the skits, there are "experimental" drinkers who "in the name of science" undergo a series of manual dexterity tests and then proceed to a Senior house or apartment to consume varying amounts of beer or wine. One main highlight of the evening is the return of the drinkers. This is where the public humiliation part comes in . . . the drinkers are subjected to an intoxylizer test and the same manual dexterity tests which they endured earlier in the evening. Comparisons are made and the results are announced to the audience to demonstrate the effects of alcohol on judgement and manual dexterity. Also, the other factors such as body size and amount of food consumed are exam-

ined for their effects on the level of intoxication.

The role playing effectively demonstrated what would actually happen if someone were pulled over for drunk driving.



#### Holiday Hysteria













campus figures singing "We Are the World."





September symbolizes beginnings at Albright College: the beginnings of both the school year and the 1984 Football season.




Despite a record of 3-6, this year's team can hold their heads high, for if nothing else they have gained valuable experience for the seasons ahead. Although the team showed tremendous effort overall, the inexperience of this young team could not be overcome.

In spite of the losses suffered on the field, a few members of the team were selected for high athletic honors. Freshman running back Matt Pammer was selected as the Eastern College Athletic Conference rookie of the year. 

Even with the substantial loss of experience due to graduation and retirement, the team and coaches look forward to a more promising season next year.
























### WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY




#### 1984 VOLLEYBALL





#### SOCCER — STILL KICKING FOR THAT ELUSIVE GOAL




# MEN'S BASKETBALL

With the loss of just 2 seniors, the 1985-86 Lady Lions can look forward to a more successful season.











































# WRESTLING — UNDERCLASSMEN PIN FRUSTRATION

With seven members returning next year, the 1986 Wrestling team can be optimistic. The grapplers do not lack talent; with an extra year of experience they may be headed toward a winning season.









Although Truslow's position will be hard to fill, she is the only graduating senior. The 1986 team should be an equally successful one due to the experience and skill of its talented members.














For the future, the loss of two outstanding performers could hurt the team, however, they can look ahead to improving on past successes to have another winning season next year.




At MACs, Becky Batdorf finished third in the 100 meter hurdles, while sophomore Sarah Dady finished third in the 400 meters.

All in all, it was a really impressive season for the whole team and all of the participants set personal bests along the way.






### Baseball


















## Softball

## **DELTA TAU CHI**



#### DR. LILLIAN ROBINSON

A new face at Albright this year is that of Dr. Lillian Robinson, who provides an integration and awareness of women's studies into our traditional Humanities curriculum. She is the Visiting Humanities Professor for 1984-85; supported by a grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities.

Most recently from Stanford University's Center for Women, Lillian has an impressive professional history. She earned her Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Brown University and a PhD. in Comparative Literature from Columbia University. She has taught at M.I.T. and at SUNY Buffalo, and has held a Visiting Chair at the University of Paris.

She is the author of several critical books, and has published two chapbooks of poetry, as well as contributing poems to more than twenty periodicals and anthologies. In recent years, she has given poetry readings in the San Francisco Bay Area and also in New York, Boston, Buffalo, Tulsa, Oklahoma City, and Taos, New Mexico.

Her interest in the field of Women's Studies stems from her finding a lack of women's experience in literature. "Few of what we consider great works have been written by women", Robinson feels, "and it is time to bring women's work into greater prominence. If the old standards allow only a man's work to be considered great, then it is time to propose new standards that allow a woman's work to be seen as great also." Robinson wants to encourage a challenge of the hows and whys of women's acceptance in the field of Humanities.

One way Lilliam Robinson is changing the way Albright students and faculty members think is through a series of faculty development seminars. Open to all, these seminars feature invited guests from all over the country to speak on topics relevant to a particular department. These sessions have focused on bringing additional information on Women's Studies to the old ways of teaching and thinking. Along with supplying new information for faculty members, Lillian's seminars also provide an opportunity for interdisciplinary discussion between the various professors and students who chose to attend.
